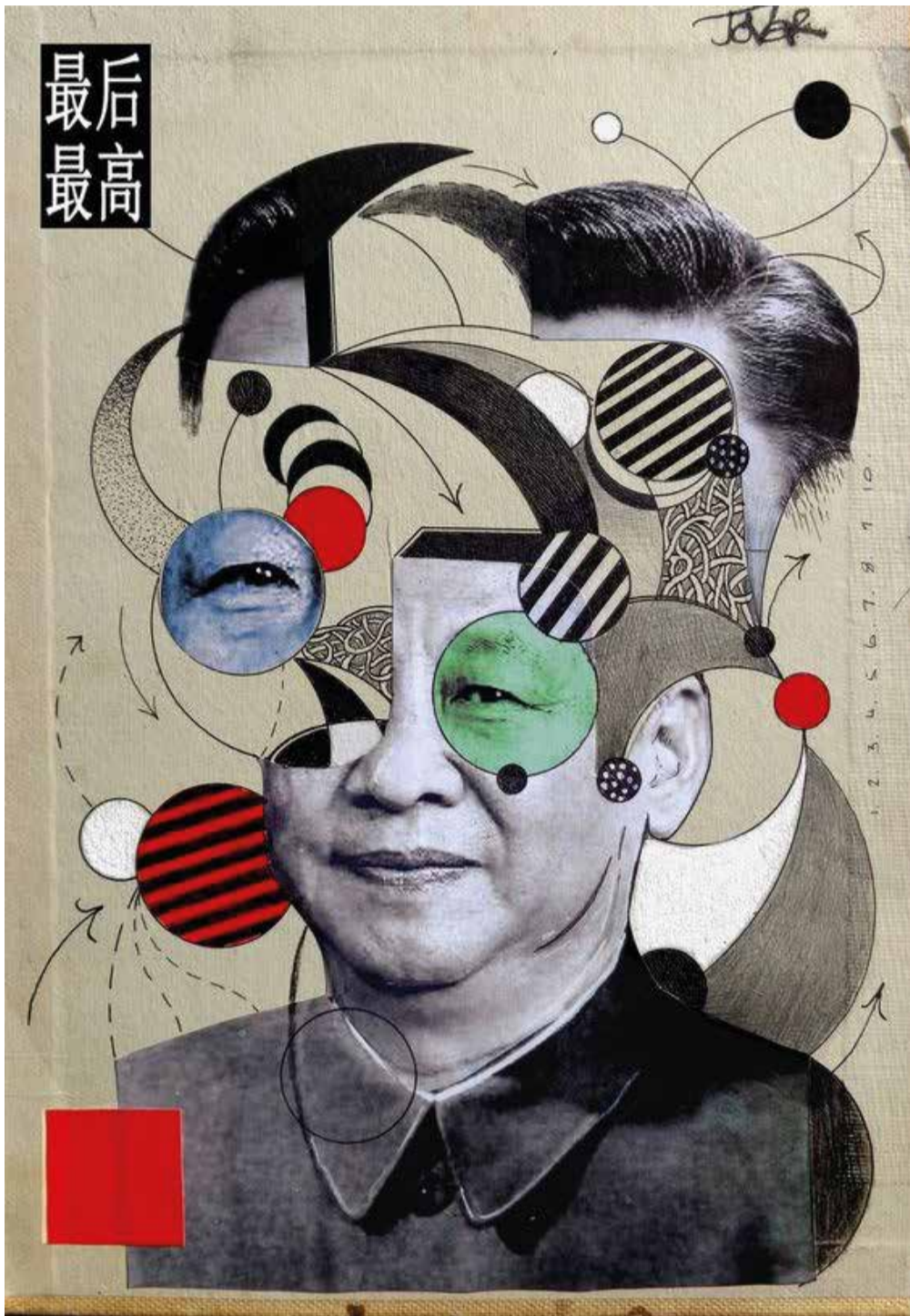


Lesson 3

First Year Art Project: ME & MY WORLD

Your Family



Look up the work of Loui Jover. He takes images of famous people and breaks them apart, before adding in shapes, collage elements, text and other patterns.

In this lesson, we are going to use Jover's process to create an unusual fragmented portrait of someone in your family.

You'll need at least one portrait photo that your family are OK for you to cut up. Alternatively, if you have access to a printer, you could take a portrait on your phone, change it to black and white and print it out.



Task 1

YOU WILL NEED

- Some portrait photos of your family
- Scissors
- Pritt stick
- Pens and pencils
- Paper
- Coins or a compass
- A ruler

YOU COULD USE

- Washi tape
- Stickers
- Stamps
- Tip-Ex or Posca Pens
- Coloured papers
- Grid paper
- Old newspaper

Look at Jover's work for inspiration. Take your portrait photo and use a pencil and ruler to lightly draw where you want to cut your image apart. Stick your fragments down onto paper of your choosing.

Use coins or a compass to draw circular forms over your portrait. Add colour with pens or pencils.

Draw over your collage creating a composition with lots of movement. Add in stamps, stickers... anything you have!



Extension task

Create a pet portrait using the same method.
